Friday, 3 April 2015

The First Regular Session of the 52nd Arizona Legislature adjourned sine die early this morning. Bills with Emergency Clauses become effective immediately upon the Governor's signature. All other bills become effective in 90 days from today.

Senate Bills

SB 1296- spousal maintenance; veterans disability benefits

Clarifies the term "requesting party" in the statute so that a veteran receiving disability who is seeking spousal maintenance will not have their disability payments considered by the judge in determining the amount of spousal maintenance awarded to that veteran.

SCM 1009- military bases; endangered species act

A concurrent memorial urging the U. S. Congress to enact legislation exempting U.S. military bases from the regulations and restrictions of the Endangered Species Act.

SCR 1014- military bases; expressing support

HB 2090- military family relief fund; amount

Would allow the Military Family Relief Fund committee to award up to \$20,000 per qualified family up from \$10,000.

HB 2091- veterans; in-state tuition (Emergency Clause; effective upon signature.)

To amend A.R.S. 15-1802 to comply with provisions of the federal Veterans Access, Choice and Accountability Act of 2014 (“Choice Act”) Section 702 so veterans and their families can use GI Bill benefits at Arizona public institutions of higher learning after July 1, 2015.

Major Actions: 15 Jan 2015-First Read and assigned to House Military Affairs and Public Safety Committee (MAPS), House Government and Higher Education Committee and House Rules Committee. 22 Jan 2015-Given a “Do Pass” recommendation in House MAPS Committee, 9-0. 5 Feb 2015-Given a “Do Pass” recommendation in House Government and Higher Education Committee, 8-0-1. 12 Feb 2015- Passed House with Emergency Clause 58-0-2 not voting and transmitted to the Senate. 25 Feb 2015-First Read and assigned to the Senate Public Safety, Military, and Technology (PSMT) Committee and Senate Rules. 4 March 2015-Given a Do Pass recommendation in Senate PSMT Committee 6-0. 24 March 2015-Given a Do Pass recommendation in Senate Committee of the Whole. 31 March 2015-Passed Senate with Emergency Clause 29-0-1 not voting and returned to the House. 1 April 2015- Transmitted to the Governor.

HB 2092- military scholarship special plates

Would create a special “military scholarship” vehicle license plate with proceeds from sale of the plates going to the Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation.

Tuesday, 27 Jan 2015-Given a “Do Pass” recommendation in House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee 9-0. 9 February 2015-Passed House 52-7-1 not voting and transmitted to the Senate. 17 Feb 2015-First Read in Senate and assigned to Senate Transportation Committee and Senate Rules Committee. 10 March 2015-Given a Do Pass recommendation in Senate Transportation Committee 3-2-2 not voting. 23 March 2015-Passed Senate 23-5-2 not voting and returned to the House. 24 March 2015-Transmitted to the Governor. 30 March 2015-Signed by the Governor. ACTION COMPLETED.

HB 2094- mobile home parks; tree maintenance NOW: voluntary veterans’ preference employment policy

Yee Strike Everything amendment adopted that would allow a private employer to adopt a voluntary veterans’ preference employment policy, provided that the policy is kept in writing and applied uniformly to employment decisions.

HB 2103- military affairs commission; membership; confidentiality

Would increase the number of people serving on the Military Affairs Commission from 13 to 16 and requiring that 12 members reside in a community in which a military installation is located, up from 10; 6 members shall have expertise in military affairs, up from 5; and 6 members shall be elected officials, up from 5. Other like changes. Would also make commission discussions on base closures exempt from public meeting law and commission strategies on keeping bases open in Arizona confidential.

HB 2106- emergency and military affairs; continuation

Would extend the Department of Emergency and Military Affairs and the State Emergency Council until July 1, 2023.

HB 2240- national guard members; tuition waivers

Would provide tuition waivers up to 16 credits per semester for members of the Arizona National Guard to complete a bachelor's or master's degree at a state public institution of higher learning if the member meets certain conditions outlined in the bill. **Beneficiary must be resident of Arizona, have Home of Record as Arizona or entered Active Duty from Arizona AND not be eligible for GI Bill educational benefits. (Kern Amendment)**

Major Actions: 29 Jan 2015-First Read and assigned to House Military Affairs and Public Safety Committee (MAPS), House Appropriations Committee, and Rules Committee. 5 Feb 2015-Kern Amendment adopted clarifying that beneficiary must be resident of Arizona, have Home of Record as Arizona or entered Active Duty from Arizona AND not be eligible for GI Bill educational benefits. Given a "Do Pass Amended" recommendation in the House Military Affairs and Public Safety Committee (MAPS) 9-0. 16 Feb 2015-Withdrawn from House Appropriations Committee. 25 Feb 2015-Out of House Rules Committee 7-0-2 absent. 26 Feb 2015-Given a Do Pass Amended recommendation in House COW. 3 March 2015-Passed House 60-0 and transmitted to the Senate. 9 March 2015-First Read in Senate and assigned to Senate PSMT Committee, Senate Appropriations Committee, and Senate Rules Committee. 18 March 2015-Given a Do Pass

recommendation in House COW. 3 March 2015-Passed House 60-0 and transmitted to the Senate. 9 March 2015-First Read in Senate and assigned to Senate PSMT Committee, Senate Appropriations Committee, and Senate Rules Committee. 18 March 2015-Given a Do Pass recommendation in Senate PSMT Committee 6-0. 24 March 2015-Given a Do Pass recommendation in Senate Appropriations Committee 8-0. 23 March 2015- Ward floor amendment adopted delaying effective date until school year 2017-18, allows member to use for any classes offered, and requires that donations be collected to pay for costs. Given a Do Pass Amended recommendation in Senate Committee of the Whole. 2 April 2015-Passed Senate 26-1-3 not voting and returned to the House. Final Passed in House 58-0-2 not voting and transmitted to the Governor.

HB 2274- emergency and military affairs omnibus

Makes a number of technical corrections in various statutes regarding the Department of Military and Emergency Affairs. As amended by the Committee on Military Affairs and Public Safety, HB 2274 authorizes the use of Camp Navajo Fund monies to support any Arizona Army National Guard training site, rather than only the Camp Navajo Site. Additionally, current law authorizes the collection of fees for the rental and use of armories and deposits the proceeds into the National Guard Fund to pay for costs to maintain armories.

The Borrelli floor amendment to HB 2274 modifies the above funding mechanisms to allow the Adjutant General to use any National Guard facility for commercial purposes, rather than only the rental or use of armories, and deposits proceeds from these activities into the National Guard Fund for use at any Arizona National Guard facility, rather than only armories. The amendment also authorizes the use of Camp Navajo Fund monies at any Arizona National Guard facility, rather than only Arizona Army National Guard training sites as specified by HB 2274, provided that all funding obligations for the Camp Navajo site are met.

HB 2294- courts; approved screening, treatment facilities

Currently, judges may sentence certain offenders (domestic violence, drug, alcohol, etc.) to complete screening at a facility approved by the Department of Health Services. HB 2274 would expand that screening to facilities approved also by the U. S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

HR 2001- American Legion; technology infrastructure improvement

A House resolution supporting the American Legion Arizona Department's efforts of improving the technology of the U.S. Department Veterans Affairs and asking the American Legion National Headquarters to create an automatic enrollment process for servicemembers into the VA system at the point of separation.

Bills That Didn't Make It

HB 2165- unlawful sexual conduct; peace officers NOW: veteran education; fund; advisory committee

Would create a Post 9/11 Veteran Education Relief Scholarship Fund committee appointed by Governor. However, there is no funding mechanism for the committee or funds from which to give scholarships.

HB 2501- women veteran special plates

Would restrict sale of existing Women Veteran Special Plates to people who can prove they are veterans and/or an immediate family member of a person who has been issued the plate. Currently, monies from the sale of the plates goes into a fund to benefit homeless women veterans.
